Bridge No. 37 along the Atlantic City Expressway Overpass Re-opens

Gloucester Township, NJ – Bridge No. 37 on Berlin-Cross Keys Road successfully re-opened nearby The Shoppes at Cross Keys. South Jersey Transportation Authority (SJTA) officials and local politicians gathered together on December 18, 2009 to mark the completion of the \$5.5 million bridge widening project to alleviate traffic congestion and improve the continuity between the roadway approach and bridge deck.

The intent of the project was to improve the quality of life for the future development of Gloucester Township and provide safe and efficient transportation for the commuters in this area. Not only is the bridge beneficial for the nearby shopping area, it created approximately 500 jobs for the workers on this project to help bolster the economy. "One of the great things I think will occur is the daily use of this shopping center will increase dramatically," said Charles Cristella, leasing agent for the Stanberry Development, LLC.

Remington & Vernick Engineers was responsible for the design of the bridge widening, ramps and roadway, traffic signals, construction staging and traffic control. The four-lane bridge was elevated and expanded to accommodate six lanes. The two additional lanes in each direction allow for dedicated turning lanes to ease traffic onto the Expressway, explained Bart Mueller, Executive Director of the SJTA. Traffic signals were relocated and replaced with steel poles, and the phasings and timings were adjusted to provide a separate left-turn phase at each of the Atlantic City Expressway on-ramps.
